Joaquin Moraga and Our School

Our school is named after Joaquin Moraga, a soldier who was given a large land grant by the Mexican government in 1845. Joaquin and his cousin received 13,000 acres in what came to be called the Rheem and Moraga Valleys. Both his father and his grandfather had helped Mexico colonize California. Joaquin's father explored and is credited with naming the San Joaquin, Sacramento, Calaveras, Merced and other rivers of Northern California. His grandfather, a lieutenant in the Anza expedition which discovered San Francisco Bay by an overland route, helped establish both the San Francisco Presidio and Mission.

Joaquin Moraga Intermediate School opened during the 1966-67 school year but served only primary grades. The following year it became an intermediate school educating sixth, seventh and eighth graders. The school colors are blue and white; the mascot was a Marauder. In 2018, the student body voted and approved our new mascot, the Jaguar.

JMIS serves approximately 650 students. Los Perales, Rheem and Camino Pablo Elementary Schools feed into JMIS. The majority of our students will attend Campolindo High School. Others will attend Miramonte High School and other local schools. Your resident high school is based on your home address and not your child's middle school.

In addition to providing a comprehensive core curriculum, JMIS offers numerous elective classes, a variety of school activities and events, and an after school sports program.

JMIS's dedicated teaching staff, comprised of 36 full-time and part-time teachers, is supported by a full time counselor, counselor paraprofessional, psychologist, speech and language pathologist, special education staff, library media specialist, writing aides, two administrative assistants, a custodial and two administrators, an incredibly supportive Parent Teacher Association, and the Moraga Education Foundation.

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Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Will my 5th Grader Visit JM this year? A: All Moraga School District fifth graders will walk to JM or board buses for the JM field trip. Members of JM's Leadership class will lead the fifth graders on a tour of the campus.

Q: Are there any transition programs for incoming 6th graders? A: WEB (Where Everybody Belongs) Day is a middle school transition program that welcomes 6th graders and helps them with their transition from 5th grade to 6th grade. WEB is an acronym for Where Everybody Belongs and this program is built on the belief that students want to help other students succeed. WEB trainers work with members of the 8th grade class to become WEB leaders. These leaders are positive role models and teachers who guide 6th graders to discover what it takes to be successful in middle school. The WEB program kicks off with a fun and energetic orientation to build excitement and instill pride in our new students. It allows our 6th graders to begin developing relationships with other students as well as learn strategies that will contribute to their middle school success. After orientation, WEB provides a variety of follow-up activities throughout the year. WEB's goal is to provide a structure in which students make real connections with each other. Through this program, funded by the JMIS PTA, students learn that people at school care about them and their success. Our counseling department, along with JM student representatives, will also visit all 5th grade classrooms this spring to make a short presentation and to answer questions from 5th grade students.

Q: Do 6th grade students select any of their classes? A: Yes, in most cases. This guide includes information about choices. Elective Course Selection is online. Parents will receive instructions via email when it is time to enroll. Elective options include Exploratory Wheel, concert string orchestra, concert band, chorus, beginning guitar, the learning center, Math Support, ELL (English Language Learner) and the Skills for Success class. Students not choosing one of the aforementioned electives will be enrolled in the exploratory wheel. The 6th grade exploratory wheel is designed to give students an introduction to some of the other exciting electives that JM has to offer. Students rotate through these elective classes (which may include: art, computers, foods and earth stewardship).

Q: What's a typical school day like at JM? A: Your child arrives at school by bus, bike, foot or carpool before the first (warning) bell rings at **8:25 AM.** The first class begins at 8:30 AM. We have block scheduling. Three periods are devoted to CORE class (English/Social Studies) with one teacher. The rest of the day will be spent changing classrooms and teachers for Math, Science, PE and the elective class until the dismissal bell. There is a four-minute passing period between classes, a longer morning break (referred to as snack recess in elementary school, but at JM it is referred to as brunch!) and lunch.

Q: May I request a teacher? A: We understand that parents hear a lot of differing talk about particular teachers, and desire the best education for their children. However, experience has shown that what works well for one student may not offer the best situation for another student. Moreover, scheduling students with several different teachers is a complex task involving many variables. If you feel your child has <u>exceptional</u> needs that school administrators should consider, please submit a written explanation of these needs to school administrators. Do not list teachers by name, but rather explain the particular learning styles of your child. Parent requests for specific teachers will not be considered.

Q: When is the Open House and What is the Spring Fling? A: Parents and students are welcome to visit classrooms during Open House, **March 15th - 6:30PM**. This is a great opportunity for first-time families to get acquainted with the JM campus and get a glimpse of what to expect in middle school! Also, come have fun at the Spring Fling, **May 4th at 5PM** where you can enjoy dinner (available for purchase), as well as music, games, face painting, and a cake walk!

Q: Do I get a locker for books? A: No. 6th grade students are not assigned lockers, except in PE class. Backpacks are the most common means for transporting papers and binders from class to class. A set of classroom textbooks will be sent home to students so they do not need to transport books to and from school. 7th & 8th grade students will have a lockers. They should bring 2 locks with them on the 1st day of school.

Q: What's the deal with PE clothes? A: Spiffy PE uniforms (shorts & shirt) can be purchased the 1st week of the school year. You'll get more information from your child's PE teacher on how to pay online. Your child will also need a combination lock or key lock for his/her PE locker. (Scholarships are available.)

Q: What about vaccinations for incoming 6th graders?

A: All incoming sixth graders must be vaccinated against Hepatitis B. It takes more than seven months to get through the series of shots. Your child must also have the **Tdap** booster and **2 doses of chickenpox vaccine** prior to entering 7th grade. You are encouraged to check with your child's pediatrician!



Q: What is School Loop? A: School Loop is an online program which shows

your child's progress, missing assignments, school news, and even allows your child to retrieve worksheets and send electronic homework. Students will sign up with their CORE teacher on the first day of school. After your child has created their account, parents can <u>register</u>. Once enrolled, you will receive a daily email listing grades and homework. **Q:** When does my child receive his or her class schedule? A: Class schedules for all students will be available online in August through your <u>Aeries parent portal</u> (different from School Loop). This is the same parent portal you've been using at your elementary schools. Do **NOT** create a new portal. You MUST have your child's permanent student ID number and verification code to access the information. Brand new students to the district will receive a letter with this information. This is the same portal you will use to choose your child's elective course requests. Students are encouraged to walk through their schedule (room locations) to get a sense of where all their classes are prior to the first day of school.

Q: What?! No recess?! A: No, no, no, we don't say "recess"! We say "passing period"! The four minute passing break is used to get to the next class. There is a Brunch and Lunch Break, during which time sack lunches or hot lunches are consumed. There is time for basketball or other games, or just "hanging out".

Q: What do I do if my child is sick, will be late or needs to leave early? A: Email (<u>imattend@moraga.k12.ca.us</u>) or call (925-376-7206, Option 1) the attendance line by 9am. We are **REQUIRED** to hear from a parent anytime your child is not at school. You must come to the office to sign out your child anytime they are leaving school early, unless we receive an email with other instructions.

Q: Do you have a Hot Lunch Program? A: The Moraga School District offers the California Universal Lunch Program which includes both free Brunch and Lunch

Q: Do you have after school sports? A: Yes! <u>After School Sports</u> was created to give students the chance to participate in sports. The program is managed by LMYA. All questions should be directed to Hillary Johnston at <u>hillaryImya@gmail.com</u>.

Q: How do I sign up for the bus program? A: Contact <u>Lamorinda School Bus</u> for general information, annual bus passes and directions on how to register.

6th Grade Math Information

Joaquin Moraga offers two levels of math courses at each grade level. Incoming 6th grade students will be evaluated on three criteria to determine their placement in our courses. The three criteria include a performance task exam, an exam of fifth grade standards, and a score based on their habits of mind, which includes fifth grade test performance, homework completion, and the ability to persevere on mathematical tasks. All of these assessments will be given in their current classroom before the end of the school year. If you are a new student to the district, your child will take a Math Placement test during registration and will be placed based on their score.

The Common Core 6th grade course will cover all 6th grade standards as set by California. The Accelerated Common Core 6/7A course will cover all 6th grade standards and half of the 7th grade standards as set by California. Students will be notified of their placement in May. If a parent or student is not satisfied with their placement, the student will be allowed to retake either or both of the placement exams before the beginning of the school year. If the student scores sufficiently on the rubric with the challenge exams, they will be placed in the accelerated course.

Traditionally, students in CC 6 will take CC 7 in 7th grade, CC 8 in 8th grade and Algebra in ninth grade. This is the sequence laid out by the Common Core standards. The majority of 6th grade students at JM will be on this path. There is also an option for students in CC 6 to gain entrance into CC 7/8A depending on their per- formance in 6th grade. This course would lead to Algebra in the 8th grade. Students in CC 6/7A will take CC 7B/8 in 7th grade, Algebra in 8th grade and Geometry in ninth grade.
