
## **JM Common Core Pathway Option**








### JM Accelerated Common Core Pathway Option

# Middle School Students' Developmental Needs

Middle School is an exciting yet challenging time for students, their parents and teachers. During this passage from childhood to adolescence, middle school students are characterized by a need to explore a variety of interests:

- High levels of activity coupled with frequent fatigue due to rapid growth
- A search for their own unique identity as they begin turning more frequently to peers rather than parents for ideas and affirmation
- Extreme sensitivity to the comments from others
- Heavy reliance on friends to provide comfort, understanding and approval.

# A Few Useful Tips:

### Use the student planner

JM provides students with a planner at the beginning of the school year. We strongly suggest that parents require their child to record all homework assignments in the planner and then check it. Although we have the wonderful Schoolloop tool, students need to develop habits of calendaring and mindfulness.

### Read course syllabi

Parents should read each course syllabus. This will provide you with information about classroom policies and expectations and will provide a timeline for major projects and assignments.

### Check homework/Schoolloop

Parents should check to see that homework assignments are being completed in a timely fashion. If students would spend a little time every day on each class, that will save a great deal of stress and time the night before an assignment is due.


## A Few Useful Tips:

### Designate a study time and place

Work with your student to pick a time and place where school work may be completed each day. Many of our students stay in the library every day until 4:00 to begin, and many times finish their homework. This relieves a lot of stress when they get home, especially when there are extracurricular activities that need to be attended to.

### Communicate, communicate

Communicate with your student's teachers by phone or email. Introduce yourself to them at back-to-school nights and PTA meetings. Ask them to contact you if ever they have a question or concern. Communicate with your middle school student. Although they are growing up and peer relationships take a higher priority than family relationships, it is important that your student knows you are available to talk to them and listen.










